








CBMS Objectives

UN Food and Agriculture Organization

Questions refer to the experiences of the respondent's household as a whole. The questions focus on self-reported food-related behaviors and experiences associated with increasing difficulties in accessing food due to resource constraints.

You ate only a few kinds of food?


You ate less than you thought you should?

Your household ran out of food?


You went without eating for a whole day?




Percentage of households that <u>were worried that they do not have enough food to eat</u> at least once in the past 12 months due to a lack of resources, **Biri, Northern Samar**



Percentage of population aged 3 to 24 years currently attending school by sex in the Municipality of Libjo, Province of Dinagat Islands




Top 3 Reasons for not attending school aged 16 to 21 by Sex, **Municipality of Libjo**, Province of Dinagat Islands





Proximity of Health Centers to Households Municipality of Anao, Tarlac






Proximity of Evacuation Centers to Households





- 3. Having granular data will also aid in proper impact monitoring to check development progress.
- 4. The PSA is committed to support the use of CBMS of the LGUs and is and will continuously conduct capacity strengthening activities and trainings for our CBMS users.
