- 812 schools (public & private elementary and secondary schools)





Increase in various health issues observed among adolescents during the resumption of face-to-face classes in 2022:


- High incidence of teenage pregnancy

- Low COVID-19 vaccination booster coverage






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Increase in various health issues observed among adolescents during the resumption of face-to-face classes in 2022: Number of Newly Diagnosed HIV Cases in the

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Objectives

To collaborate with DepEd, Philippine Red Cross, USAID's ReachHealth Project, and other agencies to deliver a package of health services for adolescents, including informative lectures and medical services in selected secondary schools in the province, to achieve better health outcomes among the youth:

- 1. Establish a team from the Provincial Health Office and partner agencies to deliver the health services package;
- 2. Develop health education materials focusing on the most prevalent health issues identified among the learners;
- 3. Develop a reporting tool to monitor the project implementation;
- 4. Create a referral network between the schools and the LGU service providers.



Implementation Methods

Preparatory Oct. - Nov. 2022

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- Creation of Planning & Implementation Team (PHO, Dep Ed, PRC, ReachHealth)
- Approval of topics and lecture materials by DepEd
- Endorsement of recipient schools by DepEd
- Coordination with recipient school and LGU


Field Implementation Nov. 2022 - Present

- Conduct of HEEADSSS assessment prior to the conduct of activity
- Conduct of Project Tib-ong Kabataan session in school
- Provision of services to identified clients
- Referral of cases to LGU service providers (RHU, MSWDO, PPO, MPS)

Feedbacking & Evaluation Nov. 2022 - Present

- Feedbacking session with school personnel, student representatives, LGU and project team
- Reporting of accomplishment
- Conduct of midterm implementation review
- Enhancement of the project based on the recommendations






Distribution of Rapid HEEADSSS Assessment Results in Selected Secondary Schools in Iloilo Province (N=1,119)






Distribution of cases based on the level of care received (N=1,119)

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Number of suicide cases in the Province of Iloilo from 2021 to 2023.

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


COVID-19 Vaccination First Booster Coverage for 12 to 17-Year-Olds in Iloilo Province, 2022-2023.

Significance/Implications

- The results underscore the project's potential as an effective outreach program for addressing ongoing adolescent challenges within school settings
- Collaborative activities, such as *Project Tib-ong Kabataan*, have intensified the adolescent health campaign among partner agencies
- Local Government Units recognized the project's efficiency and impact, motivating them to adopt the same model of integrated health services for adolescents in their communities
- The data collected by the project guided LGUs in enhancing the capacity of their service providers to better meet the needs of their adolescents



Significance/Implications

- The PHO began implementing the project in the community, specifically targeting outof-school youth, in collaboration with local officials
- The PHO hired a psychiatrist to provide expert support for the project's mental health initiatives
- The Office of the Provincial SK Federation President committed to sponsor the Provincial Integrated Service Delivery Network (ISDN) Ordinance, strengthening support for youth programs
- The DepEd SDO Iloilo mandated that all learners undergo the HEEADSSS assessment annually
- DepEd Health & Nutrition personnel and teachers are now included in PHO-led training programs, such as the Rapid and Comprehensive HEEADSSS assessment, Foundational Course on Adolescent Reproductive Health, MHPSS, Non-Suicidal Self-Injury (NSSI) Protocol, Immunization, etc.









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
