

Outline a **shared vision on preventing adolescent pregnancies** in Pasig City, protecting adolescent parents, and helping them lead better lives.



Understand the importance of an **audience-centric approach to advocacy** and the determination of **s**pecific, **m**easurable, **attainable**, **relevant**, and **time-bound objectives**.



Explain the process of **communication planning**, specifically the "C planning process."

Appreciate the importance of **audience analysis and segmentation** in communication planning.



Develop objectives for intended audience segments and determine the most **efficient**, **effective**, **and appropriate ways of reaching out** to them.



Develop **meaningful communication plans** to prevent adolescent pregnancies.

Key takeaways from the participants



There is no simple way to address adolescent pregnancies; it is a complex and multi-dimensional issue that demands a comprehensive and collaborative approach.

Socio-economic barriers and lack of comprehensive sexuality education have **impeded progress** on this front.

There is an urgent need to assist the City Government's efforts in preventing adolescent pregnancies, protecting adolescent parents, and monitoring their progress.

The workshop was a "good start to create new solutions and build meaningful connections with our community" that gave valuable insights on working for positive change.

It is necessary to **be open to different approaches**, deal with resource limitations, and prioritize cooperation.

Sangguniang Kabataan officials **must take the initiative** to kickstart the communication planning process in their respective barangays.





Challenges and Recommendations



Developing a cohesive communication strategy that respects and integrates differing perspectives while substantially addressing the core issue.

Limited resources for implementing and sustaining strategies across a large and populous barangay.

Adapting messages to align with local cultural norms and values and ensuring the active participation of and buy-in from diverse community stakeholders.

Effective communication strategies **must involve direct engagement with the community**, including teens, parents, and local leaders, to ensure that messaging is relevant and relatable.

Utilizing **online and offline communication channels** is indispensable to reach a wider audience.

Use **interactive and participatory methods** such as roleplaying, case studies, and group discussions to engage participants actively and enhance learning.

In preparation for the communication planning workshop, SK officials also conducted a **profiling of adolescent parents** with the following objectives:



Identify and analyze the factors affecting the adolescent birth rate in Pasig City.



Help Sangguniang Kabataan officials **gain a firmer grasp of ethical considerations** in research, especially surveys that involve vulnerable youth.



Produce a report on the findings in coordination with the City Health Department.

Adolescent parents who participated in the survey also pointed to some commonly-held misconceptions or views regarding adolescent pregnancies.



Entering into a relationship would, more often than not, **result in a pregnancy**. Adolescent parents **must work harder** to make ends meet.



There are lingering stigmas on sexual activity outside of wedlock. Parents would insist that they should know about their children's romantic life.



Some adolescent parents mentioned several advantages that they thought having children early in life could have.





Key takeaways from the participants



"Not all whom I encountered or interviewed for the Adolescent Parents Profiling have the same opinions and perspectives on adolescent pregnancy."

Solutions must be **determined in the specific conditions and context** of each group.

"We were able to raise difficult yet important questions regarding ethical considerations in data collection, especially when vulnerable sectors are directly involved."

Adolescent parents have **dreams and aspirations**; the hardships of an unplanned pregnancy did not take those away from them.


Adolescent parents want to **finish their studies** and **give their children a better future**.

Real, positive change is possible, but **there has to be a fundamental transformation** in how government and society view adolescent pregnancies along the way.





Challenges and Recommendations



Data gathering (and planning for it) was the most challenging part of the profiling process since not all of the participants have had any experience with it.

Some of the respondents were **too shy or hesitant** to answer the survey forms.

Some respondents **found it difficult to answer** the questions due to the **sensitive nature** of adolescent pregnancy and sex education. Such topics may have caused a degree of discomfort.

Building a safe and respectful space for discussion, where all participants can share their views without fear of judgment, is a huge challenge.

In some barangays, the **target respondents proved difficult to locate or reach**.

It is important that discussions occur in a way that **promotes open dialogue and educates without reinforcing stigmas**. Profiling demands considerable investment.


Championing **Effective Information and Service Delivery**



From July 9 to 10, 2024, Sangguniang Kabataan and Youth Development Council officials from Pasig City participated in an ISDN Planning Workshop with the following objectives:



Introduce the **Information and Service Delivery Network (ISDN)** as an intervention to adolescent health and development.



Develop, review, and standardize procedures and algorithms for facility-to-facility referrals based on focal pillars.



Simulate adolescent health and development cases to test the algorithms' viability and help refine them.




Sample Youth Engagement Flow Chart from the ISDN Planning Workshop

Key takeaways from the participants



Crafting an Information and Service Delivery Network is not an easy task; **each component or step has to be meticulously thought out**. No detail is too small.

An ISDN is a collaborative effort; all departments and offices under the LGU are integral to its success.

The importance of an ISDN for various service pillars and types of clients underscores the dangers of working in silos.

Although available information allowed the participants to begin on a directory, it needs to be constantly updated to prevent clients from falling through cracks.

It is crucial to **educate elected officials, department heads, and the rank-in-file** regarding the necessity of an ISDN.

Mayor Vico Sotto had expressed appreciation of the efforts to craft an ISDN on adolescent health and development and is interested in what needs to be done next.
